### Court/Jural Process-Addressing Harm, Trespasses and Injuries.

American common law is based on the laws of nature and nature's God: what we can observe, and revelation about what can not be observed. We follow due process, not the whims of rulers. We begin with the principle that all men are created equal. If we are loving our neighbors, following the Ten Commandments, and living in harmony with Universal Laws, we can mostly avoid court. We refer to our historical four organic laws, not ordinances and regulations. Our steps are Self-Governance, Arbitration, and Living Court, where all are considered innocent until convicted by a jury of twelve peers.

#### Seeking Remedies In A Lawful Manner

- We are self-governing and seek peace and fellowship with our brothers and sisters.
- When a harm or trespass occurs to wo/man, it is our duty to resolve the issue to restore honor for all parties.
- Each harm or trespass is considered as being between two people.
- If several people are involved in the harm or trespass, each shall be considered separately.

- Restore honor to all parties.
- If a harm or trespass has occurred, the wo/man responsible must make remedy.
- It is always assumed that the harm or trespass was accidental. (exception being evidence of intentional harm)
- Intentional harm shall be referred to Sheriff.
